Welcome to Pleasant Hill, Iowa

It is really exciting for me to welcome you all to Pleasant Hill, Iowa, the site of 61st Annual MDGA and 44th Annual MDLGA tournaments on August 3-6, 2008.

Pleasant Hill is located just east of Des Moines, Iowa. The city is a community of 6,691. The city is situated at the intersection of Iowa I63 and US Highway 65, part of the Des Moines Metropolitan Area's freeway system. Pleasant Hill is less than ten minutes from downtown Des Moines and the Iowa State Capitol and fifteen minutes from the Des Moines International Airport. Pleasant Hill has experienced rapid growth over the last ten years, with a growth rate of nearly 40%.

Copper Creek Golf Course is located just off East University Avenue in Pleasant Hill. Copper Creek Golf Club is the perfect blend of friendly and challenging. This 18-hole championship course has been designed around mature trees and rolling Iowa hills.

The hotel, Settle Inn, is in Altoona, Iowa about a couple minutes from the golf course. You will find many restaurants to eat in. It is easy drive both ways without having to fight any traffic.

Toad Valley Golf Course at Pleasant Hill opened in 1973. Its name came from a "Brady Pow-Wow" where everyone submitted names. Sixty-four names were submitted and Toad Valley was the chosen name.

Our committees work hard to get ready for the tournament. I hope everyone will enjoy the courses and events.

2007 Shootout Proves to be very Exciting...

After two rounds of golf, the 10 low scorers qualify for the MDGA shootout. At The Rail GC in Springfield, Illinois, those golfers were John Rush, Darrell Hovinen, Bob Dramin, Curtis Blankenburg, Justin Van Valey, Bill Stricklen, Bryan Jendra, Doug Schnoor and two seniors Bob Graf and Art Gendreau. It was in the high 90's and very humid. The seniors decided not to play in the shootout due to the weather. This allowed Tom Perkins and Mark Nagy to participate in the shootout. Remember this part when you read the end of the story.

On the first hole, a par 4, five golfers made par and five golfers made bogey. Bill Stricklen was knocked out as he was farthest from the hole in a five-way shootout, very exciting stuff. On the second hole, a par 3, Tom Perkins hit his tee shot just short of the green into a bunker. The bunkers at The Rail were quite hard and firm. It was very easy to get the ball out, did not have to swing hard. Tom swung too hard and sent his ball about 40 yards over the green. That led to a triple bogey, the high score of the hole, which knocked Mr. Perkins out.

On the third hole, a par 5, Doug Schnoor hit his tee shot out-of-bounds which led to a double bogey and knocked him out of the shootout. On the fourth hole, a par 4, there was a three-way shootout in which Bob Dramin lost. On the fifth hole, a long par 4, Bryan Jendra hit his tee shot out-of-bounds and made double bogey to bow out. On the sixth hole, a par 5, Justin Van Valey was knocked out with a bogey.

Now it's down to four golfers. Rush, Hovinen, Blankenburg and Nagy. Yes, Nagy, the last golfer to qualify for the shootout is still alive. On the seventh hole, a par 3 over water, Darrell Hovinen hit too much club off the tee and hit the ball about 30 yards over the green. He made double bogey and was knocked out. The 8th hole, Blankenburg used his driver to cut the dogleg carry over the pond and was close to the green in the rough, about 50 yards, but made bogey. Nagy and Rush both hit safe shots in the fairway and made par to advance to the last hole. The two most experienced golfers (Rush 52 years old, Nagy 60 years old) made it to the final hole.

Rush's tee shot on the last hole was not hit well and he was close to trees on the right side and could not reach the green. Nagy hit his tee shot very well and also failed to put his second shot on the green. Rush had the more difficult chip from the rough on the left side. Nagy was just below the green, an uphill chip. Rush missed about a 10 footer for par while Nagy made his shorter par putt (about five feet).

The last (and oldest) golfer to qualify for the 2007 MDGA Shootout is the champion. Congratulations to Mark Nagy! Anything can happen in a shootout! Anybody can win it!

There will be a shootout in Iowa this summer, the 4th Shootout in MDGA history. I guarantee it again will be an exciting event for the players and the fans. It looks like a few of the top USA deaf golfers Bill Roberts, Brandon Babineaux, Dano Aldaz, and of course, John Rush, the defending MDGA champion, will enter this tournament. If they all do, there should be a very exciting shootout this August.

We hope to make this an annual MDGA tradition.

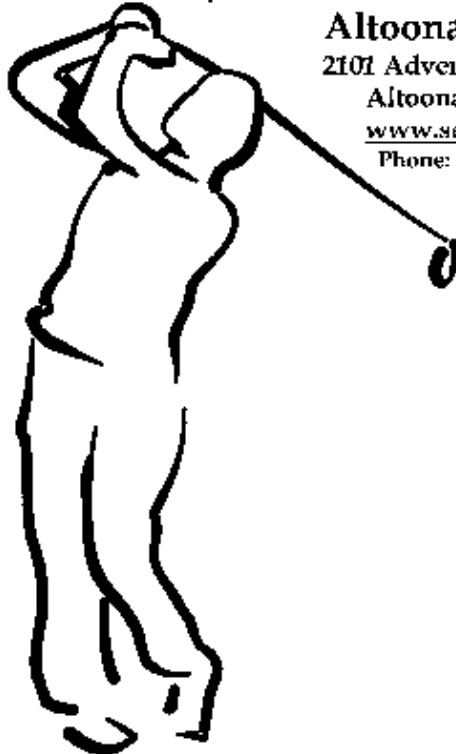

Sixteen members (mostly diehards) play different games every week collecting points. Different games such as Scramble, Best Ball, Wolf, Pink Ball, Scramble with string, 666 format, Chicago Points system, Play with just three clubs and so on. Individual tournaments are held after six weeks and at the end of season. Prizes are distributed according to the points collected.
